From the Pastor's Desk...

Sage & Columbia District Superintendency

team to start July 2026



Bishop Cedrick D. Bridgeforth intends to appoint **Rev. Dr. Troy Lynn Carr, Rev. Melissa Harkness and Rev. Dr. Rob Walters** to a superintendency team overseeing the Sage and Columbia Districts in the Oregon-Idaho Conference, July 1, 2026. Rev. Karen Hernandez will continue to serve as Columbia and Sage District Superintendent through the next appointment year before ending her tenure in the role.

Another person will be named to this superintendency team soon.

All members of the Columbia and Sage District Superintendency team are expected to continue their appointments to churches in the respective districts. However, the new appointment will reduce the time allotted to their pastoral duties when it arrives in 2026.

Rev. Carr will continue to be appointed at Gresham UMC in Oregon; Rev. Harkness will continue at her new appointment to Tualatin UMC in Oregon, which begins on July 1; and Rev. Walters will continue at Nampa First UMC in Idaho.

In December, <u>Bishop Bridgeforth announced that he would initiate a new supervision</u> <u>model</u> for the Greater Northwest Area. The superintendency team for the SeaTac District (PNW), the first district to shift into this model, <u>was announced in February</u>. The Crest to Superintendency Team, also expected to begin in 2026, <u>was announced in March</u>. And the Puget Sound team <u>was announced in April</u>.

When sharing the news of these new appointments with their current churches, Bishop Bridgeforth expressed gratitude for the clergy moving into these roles, as well as the local congregations they serve leaning into this new model as well.

When he first announced the new superintendency model in December, the bishop promised to share the anticipated transitions of the district superintendents across the <u>Oregon-Idaho</u> and <u>Pacific Northwest</u> Conferences. He also expressed his desire to announce superintendency appointments that will be fixed this June and in 2026, as he did.

With this announcement, Bishop Bridgeforth is taking the next step in naming leaders who will move into these roles. This will give those beginning their service in 2026 additional time to prepare and learn from those who will first live into this new model this appointment year.

This new model of shared superintendency continues our area's commitment to innovation in leadership and care for local churches, offering both continuity and creativity in service as we share the good news in a Wesleyan way.

Rev. Dr. Troy Lynn Carr expressed her goal in this new role:

"My commitment to the church and community is at the heart of my collaborative ministry approach," she said. "I trust the Holy Spirit is the author of this new way, and I am honored to be part of the movement."

Although this is a new model, Rev. Harkness said she's inspired by the roots of Methodism in this work:

"One thing that continues to inspire me most about early Methodism is the deep connectionalism that created spaces of belonging and accountability," Harkness said. "While still rooted in a local church and community, I am excited to help shape a new model of superintendency that cultivates greater connection and deeper discipleship in these divisive times."

Rev. Dr. Rob Walters sees this as an opportunity to build better relationships:

"This model reimagines the focus of superintendency by fostering closer relationships between the cabinet, conference staff, clergy, lay ministers and very vital lay leadership in local churches. It's through contextual connection that we help each other grow and it's my hope this model will move us into where God is calling us through enhanced collaboration."

To the members and friends of Gresham United Methodist Church:

I am writing to inform you that after prayerful discernment and careful consideration, I intend to appoint The Reverend Dr. Troy Lynn Carr as a superintendent, effective July 1, 2026. Pastor Troy Lynn's appointment as superintendent will not eliminate her appointment to Gresham, but it will reduce the time she allows for her pastoral duties.

In a recent meeting with leaders of Gresham UMC, Tualatin UMC, and Nampa First UMC I shared my intent to appoint three pastors (Melissa Harkness, Rob Walters, and Troy Lynn Carr) to serve as a superintendent team that will succeed District Superintendent Karen Hernandez upon the fulfillment of her tenure as a district superintendent. There are many questions to answer and details to address. However, there is excitement around the conference as we explore new ways of serving in this region.

You know the many gifts your pastor brings to every space. Imagine how other congregations and communities will flourish as they experience those gifts. We will work with you throughout the next year to ensure you have the support you need. This model of pastors serving as part-time superintendents to form a team is new and different, but it is a challenge we face together.

I ask that you pray for your pastor and the others joining this team. Pray for the other congregation as they grapple with this change. Pray for your congregation and community as you prepare for opportunities to serve those who need hope and help.

Thank you for being a beacon of light in what seems like some dark days. Thank you for allowing your pastor to explore other expressions of ministry while continuing to serve with you. Thank you for all you do to make life better for so many.

Why We Worship the Way We Do

Have you ever wondered why United Methodist worship looks the way it does? Our services are shaped by deep roots that reach all the way back to the early church. Before Christianity was recognized by the Roman Empire in 313AD with the Edict of Milan, Christians were a persecuted minority. Believers gathered in homes to pray, read scripture, break bread, and share in fellowship. These simple gatherings formed the foundation of Christian worship. Over the centuries, traditions developed — drawing from both Jewish practices and emerging Christian theology — but the heart of worship has always remained the same: a response to the grace of God through Jesus Christ.

In the United Methodist tradition, our worship follows a fourfold pattern: we **Gather** in community, listen to the **Word** through scripture and preaching, come to the **Table** in Holy Communion, and are **Sent Forth** to serve in the world. Our services are not just rituals or routines, but meaningful acts that form and shape our faith. We celebrate the Christian year — seasons like Advent, Lent, and Easter — to walk with Christ through the story of salvation. We also value participation, where all people are invited to engage fully with God and one another. And the beauty of it all is that worship is something we do together, as a community, each bringing our own faith, questions, and hope.

I've gathered this information while preparing for a class I'll be teaching in June based on the book *Worshiping with United Methodists* by Hoyt Hickman. As I've dug into the history and meaning behind our worship practices, I've found it very interesting — and so deeply connected to who we are as a church — that I wanted to share a little of it with you here. Sometimes when we understand the "why," the experience of worship becomes even richer.


