We have arrived at the door of Advent. In the life of the church, this is not merely a countdown to Christmas; it is a sanctuary in time, a holy invitation to slow down, breathe deeply, and reset our focus.

The world around us will tell us to hurry. It will fill our calendar and crowd our minds. But God is calling us to a different rhythm. This Advent season is our opportunity to recalibrate our hearts and once again align them with the mission we share: to be Rooted in Faith, Friendship, and Community.

To find this reset, we look at the ancient wisdom of scripture. The Old Testament reminds us that God is constantly at work, inviting us to release the old to make room for the new:

To perceive this "new thing," we must clear our vision. The New Testament urges us to shift our gaze from the distractions of the season to the Source of our hope:

"Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith." — Hebrews 12:2 (NIV)

Friends, this Advent, I invite us to stop looking at the chaos and start looking at Christ. Let us use these weeks to deepen our roots in Faith, strengthen our bonds of Friendship, and widen our circle of Community.

Please join me in this prayer as we enter the season together:

A Prayer for an Advent Reset

Gracious God, we pause now to reset our hearts. In a world of noise, we choose Your silence. In a season of rushing, we choose Your pace.

Help us to forget what lies behind and press toward the hope of the Manger. Root us deeply in Faith, that we might stand firm. Bind us together in Friendship, that no one walks alone. Build us into a community that reflects Your love to Gresham and beyond.

We fix our eyes on Jesus, and we wait with expectant hope. Amen.

The Innkeeper: Making Room for Christ This Advent -From our "Forgotten Voices of Christmas" Advent Series

Most of us grew up picturing the Innkeeper as the one who turned Mary and Joseph away too busy, too preoccupied to notice that the Messiah was at his doorstep. But Scripture never actually gives the Innkeeper a voice at all. Instead, Luke simply tells us there was "no room in the guest space." No criticism. No blame. Just the reality of a crowded world. What if the Innkeeper wasn't heartless at all, but simply overwhelmed? What if he did the best he could with what he had, and God still worked through it?

Advent invites us into that possibility. Many of us arrive at December feeling just like Bethlehem: full to the brim, running on fumes, doing our best to make space for what matters. And yet, into our crowded schedules and weary spirits, Christ still comes.

This season, the Innkeeper reminds us:

HOPE often enters through the side door of our lives, not with trumpets, but in the quiet places we didn't expect. Even when our "guest rooms" feel full, God finds a way to reach us.

PEACE doesn't require perfection. The stable was not ideal, yet it was enough. When we offer God whatever space we have—even if it feels humble or messy, God's peace can settle in.

JOY grows in ordinary places. Bethlehem wasn't glamorous, and the manger wasn't majestic, but God's joy rested there. Joy doesn't wait for us to be fully organized; it arrives in the middle of real life.

LOVE makes room. When we turn toward one another with compassion, gentleness, and patience, even small acts create space for Christ to dwell among us.

This Advent may we resist the pressure to have everything in perfect order. Instead, like the Innkeeper, may we simply offer what we have, our time and our hearts.,

And as we journey through the season of **Hope**, **Peace**, **Joy**, **and Love**, may we discover that Christ has been at the door all along... waiting for us to open just enough room for Him to enter.

Advent Study: The Forgotten Voices of Christmas

Sundays in Advent | After Worship in the Prayer Room

(Grab some coffee and a treat, then join us!)

Every Advent we read the same story — Mary and Joseph, shepherds and angels, wise men and a bright star. Yet between the lines are other voices — quiet, unseen, sometimes misunderstood. This year, we'll take a closer look at those *forgotten figures* and what their stories might teach us about God's presence in the ordinary and the overlooked.

Inspired by *Season's Greetings* by Ruth L. Boling, this four-week conversation series will help us see the Nativity through fresh eyes:

- **Week 1** (**Nov 30**): The Innkeeper The Misunderstood Gatekeeper Making space... or missing it.
- Week 2 (Dec. 7): The Shepherds' Families The Ones Who Stayed Behind Faithfulness in the ordinary.
- Week 3 (Dec. 14): The Neighbors of Bethlehem Witnesses to the Ordinary Miracle God at work in overlooked places.
- Week 4 (Dec. 21): The Midwife (or Stable Woman) The Hidden Helper The unseen hands of grace.

We'll meet **immediately after the Sunday service in the Prayer Room**. There will be time to grab coffee and goodies before settling in for conversation and reflection. We will meet for thirty minutes.

Come discover how even the most ordinary lives can reveal extraordinary glimpses of God's grace. Everyone is welcome — bring a curious heart and a warm cup of coffee!


