

From the Pastor's Desk...

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is a monumental event in human history, forming the very foundation of Christianity. By fully embracing human nature and enduring a painful and humiliating public death, Jesus was raised from the dead in a glorified physical body, triumphantly free from decay and death. This miraculous resurrection affirms Jesus'; divine identity as the Son of God, showcases Jesus' ultimate victory over death and the grave, and guarantees present salvation and future resurrection for believers.



In Christian theology, the resurrection holds a central and transformative role, serving as the cornerstone of our faith. Without the profound reality of Christ's victory over death, our salvation would crumble, leaving the gospel's proclamation hollow and Christians in despair (1 Corinthians 15:14–19). Yet, as the Apostle Paul joyfully affirms, Christ has indeed conquered the grave and emerged from the tomb, offering a powerful testament to hope (1 Corinthians 15:20). This extraordinary event creates an unbreakable bond with believers, assuring us of our own resurrection into eternal life (1 Thessalonians 4:13–18).

The early church passionately affirmed this vital connection, beautifully captured in the final lines of the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in the resurrection of the dead and the life everlasting." This declaration continues to resonate through the ages, inspiring faith and igniting hope in the hearts of countless generations.

As we approach Resurrection Sunday, often referred to as Easter, we have a wonderful opportunity for deep reflection on the theme of renewal. Let us draw inspiration from the Body Prayer that Diane shared with us during our Taizé service on March 30, 2025: "Await, Allow, Accept, and Attend to the quiet, still voice of God"; By doing so, we invite both physical and spiritual rejuvenation, embracing the holistic transformation that the resurrection brings.

The Grace of Forgiveness: Receiving and Giving

When this newsletter comes out a group of us will be in the middle of a four-week study on forgiveness and forgiving. I want to share some of what we are learning and discussing in the class.

One of the most beautiful things about God is that forgiveness is just who God is. Over and over in scripture, we see God extending grace—whether it's the father running to embrace the prodigal son, Jesus telling Peter to forgive "seventy times seven," or those powerful words from the cross: "Father, forgive them." God's forgiveness isn't grudging or hesitant. It's poured out freely, over and over again.

But let's be honest—while receiving God's forgiveness is a gift, forgiving others can be hard. Really hard. It's one thing to believe in grace, but another thing entirely when we're face to face with someone who has hurt us. In our study of Adam Hamilton's book *Forgiveness* and Desmond Tutu's *The Book of Forgiving*, we wrestled with some tough but important questions: What if the person who hurt me never says they're sorry? What if they don't deserve forgiveness? What if I'm just not ready?

Both Hamilton and Tutu remind us that forgiveness isn't about pretending something didn't happen or saying it was okay. It's about choosing not to let the hurt define us. It's a process, a journey. Sometimes it comes quickly, and sometimes it takes time. But here's the thing—when we hold on to bitterness, it doesn't just affect the other person. It weighs *us* down. And God wants better for us than that.

So maybe today, the next step is just being open to the idea of forgiveness. Or maybe it's reminding yourself that you are fully and freely forgiven by God. Wherever you are in this journey, know this: forgiveness isn't about our strength—it's about God's grace working in us. And that grace never runs out.

Finance Committee News

Finance has been very busy during the last month. While the Finance Team has been improving efficiency by adopting new software and bill payment processes, as well as also purchasing a computer that functions more efficiently, they have also been finalizing a move into the "Prayer Room" (not a comment on our finances, just the previous occupant) which will be completed soon.

An open discussion with congregation members about the budget took place after church in the Fireside Room on March 16th and over 30 people participated resulting in a useful question and answer session.

Working with the Endowment Committee and the Co-Treasurers, the Committee is reviewing various possible uses of investments as a source of funds for church activities.

A spirited discussion of how Restricted Funds might be more efficiently managed and utilized to fund church activities and reduce stress on the Endowment Fund occurred at our most recent Committee meeting. The members continue to work towards finalizing our most efficacious approach in order that the Church Council can consider the best option.



UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH GENERAL MEETING IS MONDAY, APRIL 14th at 1:30 with special guest Becky Warren...

Our OR/ID Conference Social Action Coordinator, presenting... "The Unfinished Love Story"

"Becky is one of our most dedicated District and Conference officers who has served in several positions over the years. She has graciously accepted our invitation to come speak to our United Women in Faith group about her current position as our Conference Social Action Coordinator. She is working with a group of Legislative Responders in many of our district and conference churches to promote active involvement and advocacy in issues presented to our local and state legislators. In these crazy political times, it is most important that we as Women of Faith make our voices heard in places where policies and laws are being passed that effect our citizens, our businesses, and our immigrant/refugee sisters and brothers.

We have been told that there are 11.7 to 14 million people in the United States that are undocumented immigrants, and that 108,000 undocumented immigrants reside in Oregon and 4,600 in the Tri-County area, we become overwhelmed with the magnitude of the situation.

Immigration is the Social Action priority of the Oregon-Idaho Conference Leadership Team of United Women in Faith. In a presentation titled "The Unfinished Love Story," Becky Warren, Social Action Conference Coordinator, will address how we can respond compassionately to this challenge.

Come learn about the issues that are being presented in Salem and in Washington DC... and how we can respond! And learn about this intriguing title she gave us for this occasion!

- ~~~Our Mission Giving allows our Regional Missionaries to continue empowering women in the areas of gender justice, economic empowerment, and leadership development.
